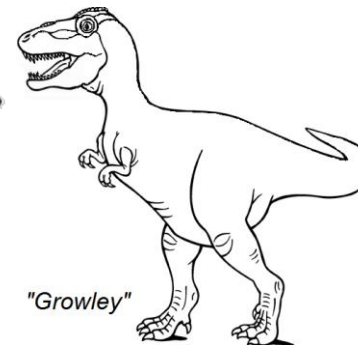

\* **Indicates Competitive Exhibit:** Competitive exhibits are judged using a comprehensive point system established by the DMS for each of the above categories depending on the level of experience (junior, novice, advanced) of the exhibitor. Exhibits are not judged against one another. A minimum of points must be earned to achieve a first, second, or third place award. The exhibit earning the most points is awarded the Best of Show. In general, judging is based on presentation, quality, showmanship, accuracy, rarity, and variety. The EFMLS has its own criteria.
